

Tanzania is a land of unique nature and beauty. From the snow-capped peak of Mt. LAKE MANYARA

A smaller, but very pretty, national park, full of life. Said to be the, "loveliest Lake in Africa," by Ernest Hemingway, Lake Manyara is well worth a visit. Lake Manyara is especially famous for its tree climbing lions, concentrated herds of elephants and the flamingos that flock to the slightly salty Lake. Giant fig trees and mahogany make up the thick forest, full of bustling activity. It is a birders paradise with over 300 species. The Lake makes a spectacular backdrop for photographers and the water supply means wildlife is abundant

OLDUPAI GORGE

One of the most important paleoanthropological sites in the world, showing evidence of inhabitation by early humans nearly 2 million years ago. You can see early stone tools and fossil remains and learn how this archaeological site impacts our understanding of human evolution. Located halfway between the Serengeti and the Ngorongoro Crater and is a 'must see' destination whilst on Safari.

ARUSHA NATIONAL PARK

Home to Mount Meru and on a clear day you can see the snowcapped peaks of Mount Kilimanjaro. Located just a short drive from Arusha it is very accessible and perfect for a day trip. Arusha National Park has the perfect mix of flora and fauna within diversified landscapes. During a game drive you will likely spot peaceful herds of buffaloes, shy bushbucks, warthogs and zebras. This Park is a great place to see the athletic black and white Colobus Monkeys

TARANGIRE NATIONAL PARK

Just south of Lake Manyara, is one of our favourites. Most famous for its large herds of elephants it also hosts a remarkable concentration of big cats. It is named after the Tarangire River that flows year-round and therefore provides a constant water supply, attracting the mammals, especially during the dry season. The Silale swamp attracts some of the best bird diversity in Africa, over 550 species. Ancient baobab trees dot the grassland plains. The vegetation includes bushlands, woodlands, rocky hilltops, deep gullies, and wetlands. No wonder it is a photographer's dream and no wonder such a diversity of wildlife make this Park their home.



SAFARI STYLES.

Our Camping Safaris allow you to fully immerse yourself in the East African wilderness, day and night. BEFORE DEPARTURE

We recommend a consultation with your local Travel Doctor for up to date advice on immunisations required. Some of these are required in advance so allow time to follow the correct schedule. Travel insurance is required and we recommend you take this out upon paying a deposit. We can advise you further upon booking.



CLIMATE & BEST TIME TO TRAVEL

DECEMBER – FEBRUARY: Wet Season

Although considered the wet season, it is still a fantastic time to go to Tanzania. Late January – February is ideal for spotting calves being born in the South of the Serengeti. The parks are green and beautiful and generally are still good for viewing wildlife.

MARCH – MAY & NOV: Wet Season

Still the wet season however with the rain, comes new life and Tanzania glows with greenery. There are not as many tourists and though some lodges and companies close down over these offpeak times, it is still possible to travel throughout almost the whole year in Tanzania.

JUNE – OCTOBER: Dry Season

The dry season is when the savannahs are yellow and the long grass waves in the hot wind. June, July and August are fantastic times to spot the Wildebeest migration in the Northern Serengeti, preparing to cross the Mara River.



WHAT TO PACK

We will send you a packing list prior to departure dependent on your itinerary. Campers will need a sleeping bag and pillow, although we can arrange hire. A day pack is a good idea for all Travelers, closed in footwear, lightweight clothes in neutral colours that can be layered for the cooler morning and evenings but warm days. Add in some sunscreen, insect repellent, sunglasses and a hat and you are almost ready to go. A pair of Binoculars is highly recommended too.



CURRENCY

The local currency is the Tanzania Shilling, although USD is widely accepted. Whilst most things are included in your trip, we recommend getting USD prior to arriving in Tanzania to cover souvenirs, alcohol, any personal shopping and tipping.



FOOD & WHAT TO EXPECT

All food is prepared and provided as per the set itineraries. All prepared food is Westernised and includes fruit, pancakes, cooked breakfasts, soups, wraps, meat, vegetables and BBQ. Food allergies and requests can also be accommodated.



PASSPORTS & VISAS

Visas are required for travel in Tanzania and although these can be arranged on arrival, we strongly advise all clients to obtain their Visa online in advance. E-visas typically take two – three weeks to be issued. Please check online as requirements may differ depending on citizenship. As with all international travel destinations, we recommend you have at least 6 months left on your passport.

8 Day, 7 Night Classic Safari

- Lake Manyara Southern Serengeti NP

This eight day Safari allows time to really immerse yourself in the Serengeti and to witness the famous Wildebeest migration. The early months of the year are known as calving season and the Herds make the Southern Serengeti their home to give birth. Tanzania has so much to offer so we include opportunities to enjoy the colourful culture and other National Parks. This Safari has the lot.

DAY **01**

LAKE MANYARA

Today we will meet you in Arusha. As we journey across the Great Rift Valley for a game drive in Lake Manyara, we think of Ernest Hemingway describing the setting as, "the loveliest I had seen in Africa". The Lake is a shallow, alkaline Lake making it one of the very best habitats for birds and is known for its spectacular flock of Flamingo. Lake Manyara is home to many Hippos but do not forget to look up for the tree climbing Lions and screeching Blue Monkeys. A small but very pretty park, full of life and will also be where we overnight.

0AY

SOUTHERN SERENGETI NATIONAL PARK

Over the next three days settle in and experience the Serengeti at a leisurely pace. Take in the vast, raw and largely untouched savannahs, with never-ending horizons. This National Park is truly defined by its local translation of "endless plains" where the great migration of millions of Wildebeest, Zebra and Impala travel from the South to the North, looking for food on the vast green pastures and to give birth. No two days in the Serengeti are ever the same. You will spend 3 nights in Serengeti National Park.



OLDUPAI GORGE via NGORONGORO

Enjoy a morning game drive as we farewell the Serengeti, followed by an afternoon visit to Oldupai Gorge. Oldupai Gorge is a site that holds the earliest evidence of human existence. Overnight will be spent in the Ngorongoro Conservation area before your early descent to the Crater floor the next morning.

LAKE EYASI



You can also visit the traditional Datoga Tribe. They are skillful blacksmiths and you can watch them make spears for the Hadzabe, as well as beautiful jewellery. After lunch we make our way to Tarangire National Park. Enjoy your last night on Safari with Sundowners looking over the Tarangire Park as the animals roam free.

Today we further explore Tarangire National Park. It is one of our favourites and such a beautiful place to spend your last day on Safari. Tarangire is the third largest park in Tanzania and a sanctuary to a large Elephant population. DAY **01**

TARANGIRE NATIONAL PARK

Today we will meet you in Arusha. Our Safari begins with a cultural drive to Tarangire National Park arriving in time for a picnic lunch. Enroute we visit Shanga, a community based project where people with disabilities create beautiful jewellery and much more – coffee is great here too! Tarangire is a stunning park with a constant water supply meaning it is home to animals and bird life all year round. There is a great diversity of wildlife including Lions, Leopards, Cheetahs, Giraffes, Elephants and Monkeys. You will overnight at Tarangire, overlooking the Park as the animals freely roam.

DAY **02**

LAKE MANYARA

As we journey across the Great Rift Valley for a game drive in Lake Manyara, we think of Ernest Hemingway describing the setting as, "the loveliest I had seen in Africa," and when you see it for yourself you will understand why. The Lake is a shallow, alkaline Lake making it one of the very best habitats for birds and is known for its spectacular flock of Flamingo. Lake Manyara is also home to a large number of Hippos. After a short drive, we will overnight in the Karatu Region.

DAY **03**

LAKE EYASI

DAY **05**


NORTHERN SERENGETI NATIONAL PARK

This five day Safari takes you to the most famous parks of Tanzania. As you journey through these National Parks the sights you see will remain in your memory long after you leave.



LAKE MANYARA

Today we meet you in Arusha and start your adventure journeying across the Great Rift Valley for a game drive in Lake Manyara. The park has breathtaking scenery and is famous for its lush acacia forest, giant figs and mahogany trees. You will see Giraffes, Elephants, Impalas and a huge number of Buffalo and Hippos. Don't forget to look up for the tree climbing Lions. The landscapes of Lake Manyara are very picturesque and the game drives along the lake provide stunning photo opportunities. From here we drive towards the Ngorongoro Crater to overnight in preparation for our descent early tomorrow morning.



NGORONGORO CRATER

We begin our descent onto the crater floor at first light this morning. The Ngorongoro Crater, is a UNESCO world heritage site, a Wonder of the Natural World and incredibly beautiful. It is one of the very rare locations where you may witness the Black Rhino. As you descend into the crater have your cameras ready as this is one of the most magnificent views you will ever see, it is truly spectacular. The only animal you will not find in the crater is the Giraffe, as it cannot walk down the steep rim edge. After the crater we make our way into the Serengeti to spend the night, a long drive but a spectacular one.



SERENGETI NATIONAL PARK

We make the most of our time in the Serengeti, getting up early to enjoy a morning game drive, whilst the Predators are actively on the hunt. The landscape is wild and raw, with vast plains and savannahs, rocky outcrops and baobabs painting a distinct picture. Take lunch and stay out all day for the best opportunity to see the 'Big 5'. The Serengeti has something to offer all year round. Take time just to soak up the serenity and the enormity of Tanzania's natural treasure. Again, we will overnight in the Serengeti to take advantage of the time we have in this spectacular park.



SERENGETI NATIONAL PARK

A morning game drive as we farewell the Serengeti, again tuning into the natural rhythms of animal activity, early in the day. The Circle of Life is the reality of the Serengeti and it is both harmonious and brutal at the same time. Every day is a new and different day. We drive on to Tarangire National Park, the third largest National Park in Tanzania and home to an abundance of large Elephant herds. Enjoy your evening drinks, known as sundowners, at your overnight accommodation looking over the Tarangire Park. The perfect backdrop for stunning photos.

Majestic baobab trees are a magical feature of Tarangire National Park, providing sanctuary for many magnificent colourful birds. All the animals congregate along the Tarangire River, which provides the only permanent water supply in the area, to drink and bathe. There is a great diversity of wildlife including Lions, Leopards, Cheetahs, Giraffes and Monkeys. This park is one of our favourites and a beautiful place to conclude your Safari. The time has now come to make our way back to Arusha and bring your Safari to an end.

LAKE MANYARA NATIONAL PARK

Today we meet you in Arusha and start your adventure journeying across the Great Rift Valley for a game drive in Lake Manyara. The park has breathtaking scenery and is famous for its lush acacia forest, giant figs and mahogany trees. You will see the fast growing population of cheeky Baboons, screeching Blue Monkeys and spectacular flock of Flamingo. The landscapes of Lake Manyara are so picturesque and the game drives along the lake provide stunning photo opportunities. After all, Ernest Hemingway proclaimed it to be "the loveliest lake in all of Africa". We will overnight in the Karatu Region before continuing on to the Serengeti tomorrow.



SERENGETI NATIONAL PARK

Today we make our way to the Serengeti, allowing time for you to settle in and soak up all of its wonder over the next two days. In the local language, Serengeti means "endless plains" and that is what you will witness as far as the eye can see. Raw, vast and largely untouched. It is the home of the Great Migration, two million Wildebeest, hundreds of thousands of Zebras and all kinds of Antelope travel on a continual cycle in search of food. After a full day in the Serengeti you will soon hear the sound of silence - no industrial noise will fall upon your ears. It is so silent, yet when the Lion roars you know you are alive. We will spend two nights in the Serengeti.



NGORONGORO via OLDUPAI GORGE

After a hot breakfast and one last game drive, we farewell the Serengeti commencing our journey to the Ngorongoro Conservation Area. Along the way we will stop and visit Oldupai Gorge, a site which holds the earliest evidence of human existence, including the preserved first human footprints. We will stay near the Ngorongoro Crater rim in preparation for our descent to the Crater floor early tomorrow morning.

NGORONGORO CRATER

The Ngorongoro Crater, a UNESCO world heritage site, is simply breathtaking. We will start early this morning and as you descend into the crater have your cameras ready as this is one of the most magnificent views you will ever see. Enjoy the wildlife living within the natural boundaries of the steep Crater walls, the circle of life is epitomized. The crater spreads for 102 sq. miles and has 2000ft high walls, a small river, and a soda lake full of Flamingo. After a picnic lunch by the Hippo Pool, we leave the crater and make our way back to the Karatu Region where we will spend the night.



LAKE EYASI

Lake Eyasi is a wild, scenically stunning area where you can get a real insight into the way some of Tanzania's fascinating tribes live. First stop is a visit to the Hadzabe tribe who are one of the last hunter and gatherers in the world. It is a hands-on experience where you can attempt to shoot the bow and arrows and go hunting for the days food. Following this we can also visit the Datoga tribe who are skillful blacksmiths. This afternoon we enjoy a game drive arriving at your accommodation for sunset.



TARANGIRE NATIONAL PARK

Tarangire National Park is one of our favourites. Majestic baobab trees, swamps, grasslands, rocky ledges and a mountainous back drop all set the spectacular scene for pictures. The large herds of Elephants are a highlight and the big Cats won't disappoint either. The time will eventually come for us to leave the park as your week of Safari and sunsets comes to end. We trust the memories will last a life time.

Travel at a pace that allows you to relax and really soak in the culture, colour, history and hospitality that Tanzania offers. This Safari allows you a variety of game drives to see the diverse animal life and bird life. A great opportunity to spot the Big 5 and to escape from normal life for a while. Your experience will return you home rejuvenated.

DAY **01**

ARUSHA NATIONAL PARK

Today we will meet you in Arusha and our first stop is Arusha National Park, home of the elusive Colobus Monkey so keep you cameras ready and be sure to look up. On a clear day you can see the snowcapped peak of Mt Kilimanjaro as you overlook the plains of roaming elephants and wildlife. Following this we head to Tarangire for our first overnight stop.

DAY **02**

TARANGIRE NATIONAL PARK

Breakfast is followed by a full day game drive through Tarangire National Park, it is one of our favourites. Though the big Cats never disappoint, the large herds of Elephants are always a highlight. It is so humbling to watch the family dynamics play out, led by the Matriarchs. This is a stunning park with a constant water supply meaning it is home to an abundance of animals and bird life all year round. Tonight we will remain in Tarangire National Park before heading out to Lake Eyasi.



LAKE EYAS

Home to the Hadzabe bushmen, Lake Eyasi is one of the few places remaining in Africa where tribal life is still maintained relatively untouched by the development of the region. The Hadzabe people have called Lake Eyasi home for more than 10,000 years, and still retain their hunter gatherer lifestyle. Following this we can also visit the Datoga tribe, who are skilled Farmers and Craftsmen. Watch the blacksmiths at work, making spears and beautiful jewellery. Tonight we stay in the nearby Karatu Region.



SERENGETI NATIONAL PARK

Serengeti means "endless plains" and that is what you will experience, vast, raw and largely untouched. This 10 day Safari is perfect for the avid explorer allowing three full days in the Serengeti; giving you the best opportunity to experience as much wildlife as possible. 
NORTHERN SERENGETI

The Mara River is close by, so we are in prime location to see a river crossing, the only option for the herds heading to greener grasses. Witnessing the herds is a spectacle itself, a river crossing is the ultimate! We will spend both nights at the same camp, where we will return each evening.

This morning, we will have the opportunity for a unique and unforgettable glimpse into an ancient culture. The Hadzabe people have called Lake Eyasi home for more than 10,000 years and still retain the hunter and gatherer lifestyle. You can enjoy a hands on experience and you hunt with the Tribesman or perhaps test your skills with a bow and arrow. Following this we can also visit the Datoga tribe, who are skilled Farmers and Craftsmen. Watch these skilful blacksmiths at work making spears and beautiful jewellery. By midafternoon we will arrive in Karatu to overnight at Gibbs Farm in time to check in and have a look around the property prior to dinner, as it is stunning.





GIBBS FARM, KARATU

Carrying on with our cultural theme from yesterday, we spend today exploring this magnificent property. Gibbs Farm is a working farm and coffee plantation with a huge garden that you can explore and interact with the events of the day. There is on site local Artists, farm and garden activities, storytelling, glorious flowers and trees, views and much more. Explore the local village of Karatu or venture to the Elephant Caves via a challenging walk through the waterfalls. Enjoy a hot lunch at Gibbs Farm and of course some of the coffee they grow and roast themselves. It is quite amazing to wander through and the setting itself is truly beautiful.



LAKE MANYARA NATIONAL PARK

After breakfast, we enjoy a game drive through Lake Manyara National Park. Said by Ernest Hemingway to be the "loveliest Lake in Africa", the breathtaking scenery includes lush acacia forest, fig and mahogany trees. The lake itself is a shallow, alkaline lake making it one of the very best for engaging in birding and it is known for its spectacular flock of Flamingo. Vegetation is dense, though be sure to look up to spot the tree climbing Lions and screeching Blue Monkeys. A small, pretty park full of life where. We venture to Tarangire National Park where we will overnight.



TARANGIRE NATIONAL PARK





The key objective is to build a generation with a vision and a mission to make a difference in their personal lives for their families and community at large. Mama Warra is a woman of faith who believes she can achieve anything with the help of God and this inspiration is what has made her the visionary for this home for children. She started with 3 children in her own home, then moved to another rented 3 bedroom house where she housed 15 children and now because of her hard work and savings from donations given by travellers and volunteers she was able to build the current orphanage in 2007. In 2020 she now has 95 Children.





THE SCHOOL

In 2004 Modest Bayo and his wife Lightness, set up their very first classroom in Karatu. Soon, their living room was bulging at the seams with underprivileged children hoping to learn. It was then, with no financial help and aided only by other members of the community, Bayo and Lightness began digging trenches, laying foundations, mixing mortar and setting bricks all by hand, to build the schools we see there today. Today, the lounge-based classroom has expanded into Tumaini TX Pre-Primary School, Tumaini Junior School, Tumaini Senior Secondary School. With over 1,100 students (and climbing) across the three campuses is a fantastic achievement by Modest and Lightness Bayo, in collaboration with the Tanzania Education Corp. On the 19th of October 2019, 52 student received their diplomas at the first ever graduation ceremony of the Tumaini Senior Secondary School.




